#### English Writing and Reading: Curriculum Rationale

At Chapmanslade, we follow a text-led approach for our writing lessons, as well as reading lessons.

#### **Early Years**

In Early Years, we follow the Drawing Club approach, allowing pupils to explore texts and steadily build core English skills.

#### Key Stage One and Two

We use the *Literacy Tree* approach. In each key stage, we have carefully chosen a selection of texts which cover a range of genres and themes. Class teachers choose texts from the lists below based on the individual cohort of pupils' needs and interests (*the majority of texts listed are used each year*).
