1. Statement of Intent

Chapmanslade Primary School believe that school uniform is important because:

- It promotes equality and inclusion for all pupils;
- It looks smart and is both practical and comfortable;
- It makes a clear distinction between home and school;
- It contributes to a sense of community and pride in our school;
- It promotes safeguarding, particularly on school trips, by making our pupils easily identifiable.

2. Aims

- 2.1. This policy aims to ensure that academy council members, staff, parents and pupils are provided with a clear understanding of our expectations for school uniform (including PE kit). Information is included on how and where to purchase school uniform.
- 2.2. This policy should be read alongside the Chapmanslade School Behaviour Policy. Persistent or deliberate failure to comply with the School Uniform Policy will be counted as a breach of the School's Behaviour Policy as pupils are not 'ready'.

3. Expectation

- 3.1. All children are expected to wear the correct school uniform, including PE kit, and parents are encouraged to help their child to maintain a good standard of clean and tidy appearance.
- 3.2. All items of school uniform, including PE kit, must be clearly marked with the owner's name. Name tags should be checked regularly, particularly after uniform has been washed.

4. Where to buy Chapmanslade School Uniform

- 4.1. Items with the Chapmanslade School logo can be purchased on-line from [Scholars](#) (direct link here or visit the link on the school website uniform page). Other popular non-logo items can also be purchased using the link. You can also go into Scholar's store in Warminster: 42 George St, Warminster BA12 8QB.
- 4.2. Other items can be purchased from the retailer of your choice. Most supermarkets sell grey trousers and skirts, school summer dresses and related items.
- 4.3. The school and the *Friends of Chapmanslade School* regularly run a second-hand shop and accept donations of second-hand uniform from parents.
- 4.4. The school will always try to help parents who may be experiencing genuine difficulty in buying the correct items of school uniform.

5. General Appearance

Hair	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Hair should be clean and tidy; extravagant styles and/or dyed hair are not considered appropriate for school. • Hair longer than shoulder length must be tied up, particularly for PE. • Hair accessories such as slides, ribbons and bobbles should be subtle. <p style="text-align: center;"><i>The Academy Council maintains the right to decide what is appropriate.</i></p>
Jewellery & make Up	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Jewellery, makeup and nail varnish are not permitted in school. • Small stud earrings only may be worn in pierced ears. • A small, inexpensive wristwatch may be worn by children. Smart watches containing a camera are not permitted for safeguarding reasons. • Earrings must be removed or covered with tape for PE. <p style="text-align: center;"><i>The school cannot be held responsible for these items.</i></p>
Bags	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • All pupils ideally should have a purple book bag with school logo to transport reading books, knowledge organisers and letters home. • Bulky bags, such as rucksacks, are unsuitable for our school due to the limited space we have in cloakrooms and classrooms. • In KS2 only, if pupils choose to not use a school book bag, the alternative must fit an A4 folder in as we regularly send home A4 size documents.
Pencil Cases & Stationery	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Pupils should not bring pencil cases to school. • All necessary stationery items are provided.

6. School Uniform

<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Plain black shoes (should be flat and enclosed and well-fitting if slip-on) • Shoes that fasten should be with Velcro, laces or a buckle unless pupils can tie their own laces • <i>Crocs or sling-backs (e.g. open toed sandals) <u>are not permitted</u> as they are unsuitable and unsafe for school activities.</i> 	

7. PE Kit

Full PE Kit is considered part of school uniform

<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Purple drawstring PE kit bag (named) with school logo to hang on peg • Purple polo shirt with school logo • Plain black shorts • Plain or school logo black sweatshirt, hoodie or zip-up jacket • Plain black jogging bottoms • Plain white sports socks • Well-fitting trainers • Trunks / swimming costume (when pupils attend swimming lessons - prior notice will be given)
